


From our Chaplain:

Following Pentecost, the Church begins her slow descent from the great peaks of the Easter Season to the verdant pastures of Ordinary Time, the longest of the liturgical seasons. She pauses briefly, to praise the Holy Trinity — Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier; and then the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ, Corpus Christi. Like the lush June growth all around us, the green of the liturgical season points to the new life won for us by the Redemption of Jesus Christ, the new life of Charity. For Our Lord came to cast the fire of His love on the earth, and to that end, sent His Holy Spirit at Pentecost in the form of tongues of fire.

As we begin to feel the warmth of summer, we can reflect that we celebrate the feasts of **Corpus Christi** (June 2), the **Sacred Heart of Jesus** (June 7) and the **Immaculate Heart of Mary** (June 8). God is Love and the Sacred Heart of Jesus — present on earth

From our Life Director

Eighteen Democrat legislators in the NC House of Representatives have introduced HB 908, the "Decriminalize Reproductive Health Act." The bill would repeal the one-year-old pro-life legislation that decreased abortions by 31 percent in NC and put restrictions on the procedure after 12 weeks. HB 908

minimizes a father's right of action relating to the performance of abortion, criminalizes pro-life activity outside abortion clinics and facilitates bringing out of state women into NC for abortions.

Legislators have openly harassed pregnancy resource centers, including Albemarle Pregnancy Resource Center and Clinic. CEO Dee Spruce was threatened with criminal prosecution if she did not divulge five years of APRCC records to the NC Joint Legislative Committee on Governmental Operations. The legislator who requested the information was told she would get nothing from the pregnancy resource centers and was reprimanded by her legislative colleagues.

Planned Parenthood plans to spend \$10 million this year in NC campaigning to allow abortions up to nine months. This is double what the organization spent in 2022.

"The enemy has been busy trying to take us off focus here at the center," said Spruce.

APRCC needs us. Pray for them and support them financially.


From Our Family Director:


